## Election Basics & Voter Guide Policy

### You have the right to vote in an Indiana election if:

- You are both a U.S. citizen and a resident of Indiana
- You will be at least 18 years of age by the election date, **November 7, 2023**
- You are not currently in prison after being convicted of a crime
- You have lived in the precinct where you vote for at least 30 days prior to the election
- You are registered to vote

- The Candidate Questionnaire was sent to all candidates from all parties
- Candidates replies are printed without editing or verification
- Candidates are listed by district, but in no particular order
- Candidates who did not respond to our questionnaire by the provided deadline are listed with the notation, "No response received by deadline."

# What to Know Before Going to the Polls

Who is on your ballot?

- Based on your address, you will have different different different district City Council candidates to choose from
- Both the Mayoral Candidates and At-Large City Council Candidates will be on everyone's ballots
- Use this guide to make an informed decision about each candidate based on their answers to a few questions about key parts of our community
- You can go to indianavoters.in.gov to find out:
  - $\circ~$  What district you live in
  - Your closest early voting site, and election day voting site location
  - $\circ~$  Voting site hours
  - Who will be on your ballot or a "sample ballot"
  - Check your voter registration status

• A valid ID issued by the State of Indiana or the federal government



## Questions Sent to All Candidates

- 1. **Qualifications:** Why do you believe you are qualified to be the next elected Mayor/City Councilor of Westfield?
- 2. **Agenda:** What are your top 3 agenda items to address in Westfield if you are elected as Mayor/City Councilor?
- 3. **School Safety:** The national rise in school shootings has parents, school districts, and law enforcement agencies looking for ways to ensure schools are safe. Do you believe school safety is an issue of concern in Westfield? If so, what would be your plan to address these concerns?
- 4. **Inclusion:** The Hamilton County Muslim community is historically an immigrant community with limited political engagement. Organizations like IMAN have worked hard to increase voter and political engagement within the Muslim community. How do you see your role in increasing participation from groups like the Muslim community in city government and various decision making processes?
- 5. **Growth:** Westfield is one of the fastest growing cities in the country! In your opinion, what are the biggest challenges the city faces as a result of this population growth and what are your plans to address these challenges?

### **Jon Dartt** Republican City Council – District 1

#### **Qualifications:**

One of the biggest draws to Westfield is that it is a very safe place to live. We need to continue supporting our police and fire and ensure they have the talent and equipment to do their jobs. Schools. The school board has done a great job of staying ahead of the growth. New schools, remodeled schools, early learning centers, sports/activity centers are just a few of the things they are planning well into the next decade.
